Remember Your Creator

Youth feels endless until one morning it isn't. "Remember also your Creator in the days of your youth, before the evil days come and the years draw near of which you will say, 'I have no pleasure in them'" (Ecc. 12:1). The preacher, voice weathered by watching seasons turn, seems to lean in close. He knows the clock is ticking, and the invitation is urgent.

He describes old age like a house slowly collapsing. "Before the sun and the light and the moon and the stars are darkened and the clouds return after the rain" (v. 2). The "keepers of the house" those sturdy arms that once lifted burdens and cradled children "tremble" (v. 3). The "strong men are bent" (v. 3), backs bowed under invisible loads. The "grinders" teeth that chewed bread and laughed loud, "cease because they are few" (v. 3). The "windows" dim; eyes that tracked sunsets, lovers' faces, and children's first steps "are dimmed" (v. 3). "The doors on the street are shut... the sound of the grinding is low" (v. 4); the bustle outside becomes a muffled sound.

Even nature joins Solomon's description of old age. "One rises up at the voice of a bird" (v. 4) sleep is interrupted at the slightest chirp. "All the daughters of song are brought low" (v. 4); songs fade to whispers. "The almond tree blossoms" (v. 5), hair gone silver overnight. "The grasshopper drags itself along" (v. 5), once a quick mover, now a weary drag. "Desire fails" (v. 5); the spark that lit love, ambition, and appetite flickers out. "The mourners go about the streets" (v. 5), practicing their dirge before the bell rings.

Then the final images, "Remember him, before the silver cord is snapped, or the golden bowl is broken, or the pitcher is shattered at the fountain, or the wheel broken at the cistern" (v. 6). "And the dust returns to the earth as it was, and the spirit returns to God who gave it" (v. 7).

Pretty depressing picture Solomon is painting. Yet the preacher refuses despair. After twelve chapters chasing wind, wealth, pleasure, wisdom, power, he lands on rock: "The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man. For God will bring every deed into judgment, with every secret thing, whether good or evil" (vv. 13-14).

Solomon tasted every fruit under heaven and found it wanting. Palaces, vineyards, songs, gold, none outrun the grave. Only the thread tying creature to Creator endures. So remember now. Not tomorrow, when joints ache and memory fades. Not in the evil days when pleasure evaporates. Remember while the sun still climbs high, while laughter comes easy, while the heart beats strong. Lift eyes above the sun to the One who set it spinning. Walk the narrow path of obedience. Live as though every breath is borrowed and due back with interest.

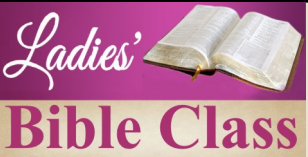
Food Giveaway
