One of the biggest problems in today's family is the lack of respect and communication that are basic elements in any successful relationship. Paul advises us: "Children, obey your parents in the LORD, for this is right." Honor your father and mother — which is the first commandment with promise — that it may go well with you and enjoy a long life on earth." And you fathers, do not anger your children, but bring them up according to the discipline and instruction of the LORD" (Ephesians 6:1-4).

In reality, both parents and children have responsibilities and duties that they must fulfill in order to achieve a good relationship and therefore a pleasant atmosphere at home. Of course, the responsibility of parents is much greater when children are young. But the responsibility of children increases as they develop physically, intellectually, and emotionally. While it is true that adolescence presents a great challenge for both children and parents, the following rules could help improve that special and important relationship for all those involved:

Respect. Respect, which is not demanded but earned, needs to be mutual. Children will respect parents who show them respect. To obey is to recognize authority. Obedience leads directly to love and respect. Parents who want to improve their relationship with their children, rather than constantly pointing out their mistakes, faults, and ineptitudes, may want to study their gifts, talents, abilities, and interests in order to help them realize their dreams.

Listen. The key element of good communication is knowing how to listen and thus earn the privilege of being heard. It is not simply listening to what the other person says, but paying attention with the desire to understand them.

Always tell **the truth**, but with love, so that it may be edifying and not destructive. This will inspire trust that cannot be missing in a good relationship.

Acknowledge when you have made a mistake, a fault, or an offense, and ask for forgiveness.

When it comes to seeking a **rapprochement**, do not wait for the other person to take the initiative; take it instead. Chances are, the other person is not just waiting but wholeheartedly wanting you to seek them out.

Because sacrificing for others is not in our nature, human relationships are difficult for us, especially at home. However, God offers us an answer through His Son, Jesus Christ. He is able and willing to bring the healing that our lives and homes so desperately need. Christ is the answer!
