**What Must I Do To Be Saved?**

Hear the gospel - Acts 15:7  
Believe the gospel - Mark 16:15-16  
Repent of sins - Acts 17:30  
Confess Christ - Rom 10:9-10

In Romans 8:34, Paul poses a profound question: “Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.”

Instead of condemning us, God sent His only Son to justify us.

### Christ's Sacrifice

The question, “Who is to condemn?” is clearly answered by Christ Himself. He is the one who has the authority to condemn, yet Paul emphasizes, “Christ Jesus is the one who died.” This statement stands as a testament to God’s immense love for us; rather than pass judgment, He offers us the incredible gift of His Son.

Paul has often highlighted the significance of Christ’s death. This act of sacrificial love forms the very foundation of our faith. Romans 5:8 states, “But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.” His death was not just a historical moment; it represented the ultimate expression of love and redemption. Though we were sinners deserving condemnation, Christ willingly died for us.

Consider the magnitude of this sacrifice. How often do we find it difficult to forgive those who hurt us? Yet, on a grander scale, while we were steeped in sin, Christ chose to die for us. While we were turning away from God, Jesus was sacrificing Himself on our behalf. When we confront the weight of our sins, feelings of guilt and shame may overwhelm us. However, we must remember that Christ bore our sins, allowing us to stand before God as blameless. His death paid our debt, granting us forgiveness and grace. As believers, we can confront our past without fear, knowing that Christ has already addressed it on the cross.

### The Power of the Resurrection

Paul continues: “Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised.” The resurrection signifies more than just Christ’s return; it represents the cornerstone of our faith and a triumphant victory over death and sin. Romans 6:9 asserts, “We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.” His resurrection assures us that death is not the end, freeing us from its fear.

Because Christ conquered the grave, we too are offered the hope of eternal life. Our resurrected Savior empowers us to live victoriously today. We need not dwell in the shadows of condemnation; instead, we can embrace the new life granted to us through Him. The resurrection not only secures our salvation but also transforms our lives, enabling us to rise above struggles and experience the freedom from fear and sin.

What remains to fear in death? For the faithful Christian, death is merely a passage to a glorious reunion.

### Christ's Ongoing Intercession

Returning to Romans 8:34, Paul asks again, “Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.” Picture this: Jesus, our advocate, standing before the Father, speaking on our behalf. This image brings immense comfort. When we face accusations—from the enemy, our own doubts, or the world's judgments—Christ stands as our defense. He is our advocate in the courtroom of God, ensuring that we face no condemnation. Instead, we receive grace, mercy, and love. This truth should inspire hope and assurance in our hearts.

A powerful example of Christ’s intercession can be found in Luke 23:34, where He prays, “Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.” This prayer was offered for those who were actively participating in His crucifixion. Jesus chose to seek forgiveness for His murderers rather than their condemnation.

What do you think He is doing for you now? The same Savior who died for you is your advocate before the Father, continually interceding on your behalf.

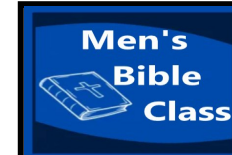
